I have a degree in Geography and History from the Complutense University in Madrid, where I also earned a Diploma of Pedagogical Aptitude (Spanish teaching certificate). I qualified as an Expert in Teaching Spanish as a Foreign Language (EXEELE) at Antonio de Nebrija University in Madrid. I have also completed a Teacher Training course run by the International House Teacher Training Institute, which covered the latest methodology and techniques of language teaching.

Professionally, I worked in England for nine years, teaching Spanish as a Foreign Language at Cambridge University and the Cervantes Institute of London, among others. I also tutored students preparing for official exams at the London Chamber of Commerce and Industry, the Royal Society of Arts and the DELE at the Cervantes Institute. In 1997 I presented “The Language Challenge Seminars” at the London Language Show, and I also participated in workshops and seminars at Goldsmiths College (University of London) and at the Delegation of Education at the Spanish Embassy in London. I also worked as a translator and editor of a British magazine, and collaborated in the subtitling of Spanish films for the BBC.

In Spain I have worked as a teacher of Spanish as a Foreign Language at International House and Hyland Language Centre in Madrid.

I have been working at ESIC, teaching English and Spanish classes since 2006. I am currently teaching Spanish Language and Culture at ESIC Madrid.
